### Message from the Executive Director and President of the Board

#### Dear partners and participants,

Recent research studies have found that the pandemic had particularly negative impacts on the employment, education, personal finances and social lives of youth. According to these same studies, public policies can mitigate these consequences if they support measures that allow agencies and organizations to adapt their interventions to each individual's specific situation and experience (i.e., precarious employment, lack of qualifications to work in sectors with a high demand for labour, difficult Community organisations and other social-change actors must be equipped and ready to respond to these new realities quickly and effectively. Of course, these same groups need adequate funding and a qualified workforce with good working conditions to be able to do so. The return of partial but recurring mission-based funding for the CJEs was announced earlier this year. This news leads us to believe that we will be able to have a greater impact on the lives of our participants, especially those most vulnerable.

Our Board, staff and volunteers will meet the challenges of the coming years with patience, proactivity, passion and dedication. 

The core of our mission is without a doubt centered on our employability services that allow all individuals over the age of 16 in the territories we serve to benefit from personalised support in their socio-professional integration process. This year in particular (with the arrival of COVID-19), our entire team of career development counsellors and intervention workers adapted quickly to the transformation of all our services to a hybrid form combining online and face-to-face interventions. Overall, in our opinion, even though the job market was not favourable and there were fewer jobs, there was still an increase in demand for information on training programs and the various support measures offered the government.

Our mentoring program, Québec Pluriel, matches young immigrants with mentors in their fields of interest so that they can share their experiences and advice. Over the years, we have been able to create fruitful connections with experienced professionals who have generously given their time. On this same note, we extended our relationship with employers to better assist job seekers with employment opportunities.





# Employment, Mentorship and Career Exploration Support

#### We also build a partnership with Bienvenue à NDG to create the Notre Diversité Gagnante project.

The goal of the initiative is to offer real employment opportunities that contribute to the integration of newly arrived residents in the Notre-Dame-de-Grâce neighbourhood. The project offered participants the opportunity to attend workshops that prepared them to enter the Quebec labour market and then put them in touch with potential employers. We plan to expand this pairing service over the years to come and to make it available for all our participants.



#### From an Idea to Starting a Business


The CJE NDG works in schools and with youth in our community between the ages of 15 and 30 specifically through its CRÉNEAU CJE mandate. This component of our services is meant to encourage school perseverance and personal and social autonomy for young adults, as well as create learning opportunities through entrepreneurship and volunteer projects. This year, with the usual support of Quebec's Youth Secretariat and the financial support of other partners such as Desjardins, the Fondation Centraide du Grand Montréal and Réseau Réussite Montréal, as well as that of MNA Kathleen Weil, we were able to continue our exchanges with schools and youth. We offered support to school professionals, laptops to youth as well as online or face-to-face psychosocial support when possible.

To date, we serve five high schools, using experiential projects and programs to help youth discover their strengths and future career possibilities. We have even transformed the hip-hop learning workshops we deliver in collaboration with **W.O.R.D** into a guidebook for youth.


#### **NDG Snow Brigade**

For two years now, we have been working with the borough of CDN-NDG to offer a snow removal service to residents with reduced mobility. Ten youth volunteers helped more than twenty homes throughout our long Quebec winter.



#### **Our Organisations** on Screen

A team of two young videographers decided to offer their video-making services to two NDG organisations during the pandemic by creating videos they can use to market.





#### Supporting Montreal's homeless

Three young volunteers got together and decided to collect winter wear for Montreal's homeless shelters that saw an increase in users due to the pandemic. 115

#### Our Digital Future - c'est ICI!

As many borders around the world closed, the project, **Our Digital Future – C'est ICI**, became of great importance. Since 2019, the CJE NDG has worked in partnership with the **Goethe Institute** in Montreal and **Think Young** in Europe in order to bring together young Canadians and Europeans. The goal was to create a series of events that would allow teams to make policy recommendations that will increase youth participation and inclusion online. Our events that were meant to be in-person in different Canadian and European cities were quickly redesigned to accommodate a 100% online participation. The project was a success for the youth and all partners involved.





The TJNDG brings together NDG organisations that work with families and youth between the ages of 6 and 30. Its mission is to support and consolidate the work of its members while promoting and encouraging actions to improve the quality of life and health of the targeted population.

In 2020-2021, the TJNDG conducted its in-person, group projects in line with public health measures. Homework support programs were mainly offered online and had to be reduced, but NDG youth were able to receive more personalized help. The new teen tutoring program was also moved online and matched 19 youth with a volunteer tutor. Over the last year, the youth worker conducted a lot more one-on-one interventions. Many young people were referred to him mainly due to challenges brought on by greater levels of isolation.

The TJNDG also worked on a new youth portrait, which will be released in the Fall of 2021 and will be the base for its strategic planning process. The need for mental health support arose as a pressing issue throughout the focus groups and research. With this in mind, the TJNDG members want to dedicate a part of Quebec's Public Health Department's grant to the development of a new collective mental health project.


